Nurse Anesthesia Certification Board Names New Chief Executive Officer

Experienced Executive Leader John Preston, DNSc, CRNA, FNAP, APRN, to Guide NBCRNA

CHICAGO, March 29, 2021 – The National Board of Certification and Recertification for Nurse Anesthetists (NBCRNA) announces today that John Preston, DNSc, CRNA, FNAP, APRN, will become its new Chief Executive Officer (CEO) effective April 15, 2021. The current CEO, Karen Plaus, PhD, CRNA, FAAN, CAE, is retiring after a planned leadership transition.

Dr. Preston brings to his new role more than 36 years of experience in nursing and advanced practice nursing, of which 25 were spent leading nurse anesthesia education and professional development. He served as the Associate Program Director at Rosalind Franklin University, the Graduate Program Director for the University of Tennessee, and the Senior Director of Education and Professional Development at the American Association of Nurse Anesthetists prior to coming to the NBCRNA as the Chief Credentialing Officer in 2015. In addition, he has held numerous roles in credentialing, nursing regulation, higher education administration, and nursing practice.



A results-oriented, innovative leader, Dr. Preston is known for his strategic foresight, operationalizing complex business processes, maximizing human and financial resources to strengthen services, and developing high performing teams. He has a proven track record of organizational success and visionary accomplishments.
